

Ultimate Texas Hold'em Poker



The game is played with a normal 52-card deck without jokers. The player must make an ante and a blind bet. Both bets must be identical. In addition, the player can make a trips bet. The bet is independent of the ante, play and blind bets. It is paid out completely independently of what happens with the rest of the round, even if the player passes or loses the hand.

Start of the game

Two cards are dealt to the player and the dealer face down. The player can take a look at his/her own cards. The player can then decide only to make a play bet that is three times or four times the amount of the ante bet or to check.

Flop

The dealer burns a card (discards the top card)
The dealer deals three community cards – the flop.
If the player had previously checked, he/she can make a play bet in the amount of double the ante bet.
If the player had previously made a play bet, he/she is not allowed to make any further bets.

Turn and river

The dealer burns another card

The final two community cards are dealt: turn and river. If the player had previously checked two times, he/she must either make a play bet equal precisely to his/her ante or pass, in which case he/she loses both his/her ante and blind bets.

If the player has already raised, he/she is not allowed to make any further bets.

Showdown

The player and the dealer each create the best possible hand with any combination of their own two cards and the five community cards. The normal poker rules apply with respect to ranking the hands.

The game is played on a table with seven seats, with four boxes in front of each player. Closest to the player is the «play» box, followed by the «ante» box and the «blind» box. Farther away from the guest is the «trips» box.

Betting options

Ante: Ante is the initial bet for this game. If the dealer qualifies, and if the guest has a better hand, the ante is paid out 1:1. If the dealer's hand wins, the ante is collected. If the dealer doesn't qualify, the ante is returned immediately to the guest.

Blind: The blind bet is equal to the amount of the ante and is a mandatory bet in Ultimate Texas hold 'em poker. The blind is paid out pursuant to the table irrespective of the dealer's qualification, but only if the guest's hand wins with at least a straight. If the guest wins with less than a straight in his/ her hand, the blind bet remains in place and is not paid.

Play: The guest must make a play bet if he/she wants to bet against the dealer. The amount of the play bet varies depending on when the guest decides to bet. Before the flop, the guest can decide whether to make a play bet that is three times or four times the amount of the ante. Before the turn and river, he/she can then bet only twice the amount of ante as a play bet, and after the turn and river, then only the amount of the ante. If the guest has a better hand than that of the dealer, this bet is paid out 1:1. If the dealer's hand wins, it is collected. In the event of a tie, this bet remains in place.

Optional trips bet: The trips bet is paid out irrespective of the dealer's hand pursuant to the corresponding table with three of a kind or better. Otherwise, it is collected. If three of a kind or a higher winning combination is on the board, the guest has the option to fold while leaving the trips bet in place. To do this, he/she slides his/her cards under the trips bet. In that case, the ante and play bets are collected by the dealer. His/her trips bet is then paid out in the normal sequence.

Payouts

Payouts differ depending on whether the dealer qualifies or not.

Dealer qualification: The dealer's hand qualifies only if he/she has at least one pair.

Payouts if the dealer qualifies: The player's hand is better than that of the dealer: the player wins the ante and play bets, as well as the blind bets according to the table.

The player's hand is worse than that of the dealer: the player loses all bets.

The player's hand is the same as that of the dealer: The player receives all bets back.

In the event of disputes, the final decision is made by management.


